Preparation for Worship: 1 John 1:3

That which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ.

Call to Worship: I John 1:1-2

That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life—the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us.

Invocation

Confession of Sin: *I John 1:5*

Leader: This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all.

All: Almighty God of life and light, we confess that our eyes have been clouded with the concerns of life, the troubles of the world, and the hardness of our own hearts. We have often experienced your love but have not given that loving experience to others around us. We have missed your purpose and priorities in our lives. Forgive us for considering ourselves more important than others. Remind us again of how Christ gave his life for us. Make yourself known to our darkened hearts again, Lord Jesus and shine your light of hope through us to those around us.

Assurance of Pardon: 1 John 1:4-7

And these things we write, so that our joy may be made complete. And this is the message we have heard from Him and announce to you, that God is light, and in Him there is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with Him and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth; but if we walk in the light as He Himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin.

+Confession of Faith: Ligonier Statement on Christology

We confess the mystery and wonder of God made flesh and rejoice in our great salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord.

With the Father and the Holy Spirit, the Son created all things, sustains all things, and makes all things new. Truly God, He became truly man, two natures in one person.

He was born of the Virgin Mary and lived among us. Crucified, dead, and buried, He rose on the third day, ascended to heaven, and will come again in glory and judgment.

For us, He kept the Law, atoned for sin, and satisfied God's wrath. He took our filthy rags and gave us His righteous robe.

He is our Prophet, Priest, and King, building His church, interceding for us, and reigning over all things.

Jesus Christ is Lord; we praise His holy Name forever. Amen.

Questions to prepare for NEXT week: Read Colossians 3:12-17 1. In verse 12, what does it mean that Paul uses the metaphor of "put on (as in getting dressed)" in referencing how we ought to comport ourselves? 2.Why is it, that after all the positive attributes in verse 12, Paul follows up with discussing the burdens of bearing with other people? 3. In verse 17, what does it mean that in word and deed you do everything in the name of Christ?
