Mother's day prayer

Leader: Lord, today we set aside to honor and remember mothers so we give you thanks for our mothers. All: Grant them comfort in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Leader: We pray for mothers who aborted their children.

All: Grant them healing and peace as they look to You.

Leader: We pray for moms who gave up their children for adoption.

All: Grant them peace and confidence as they trust in Your providence.

Leader: We pray for adoptive mothers.

All: Grant them joy and gratitude for the gift You have provided.

Leader: We pray for girls and women who think about being moms.

All: Grant them wisdom and discernment.

Leader: We pray for women who desperately want, or wanted, to be moms.

All: Grant them grace to accept your timing and will, and heal their pain.

Leader: We pray for all women who have assumed the mother's role in a child's life.

All: Grant them joy and let them hear Your voice.

Leader: We pray for those people present who are grieving the loss of their mother in the past year.

Reflection question from today's sermon: 1. Speaking is a common element to all the gifts of the spirit. Can you think of someone who might have difficulty expressing themselves but who has had a significant ministry in your life? What was it about their speaking that ministered? 2. Think about the impact of your words on others. It is not just what is said, but the way we speak that makes a difference. What change do you wish you could make in the way you speak to others in the body of Christ?

Preparation questions for Next week: Read Ephesians 4 again. 1.What is the difference in speaking the truth when the outcome is hurtful and when the outcome is helpful? 2. What can you say to friends and neighbors that might help them join us in worship at Grace?
